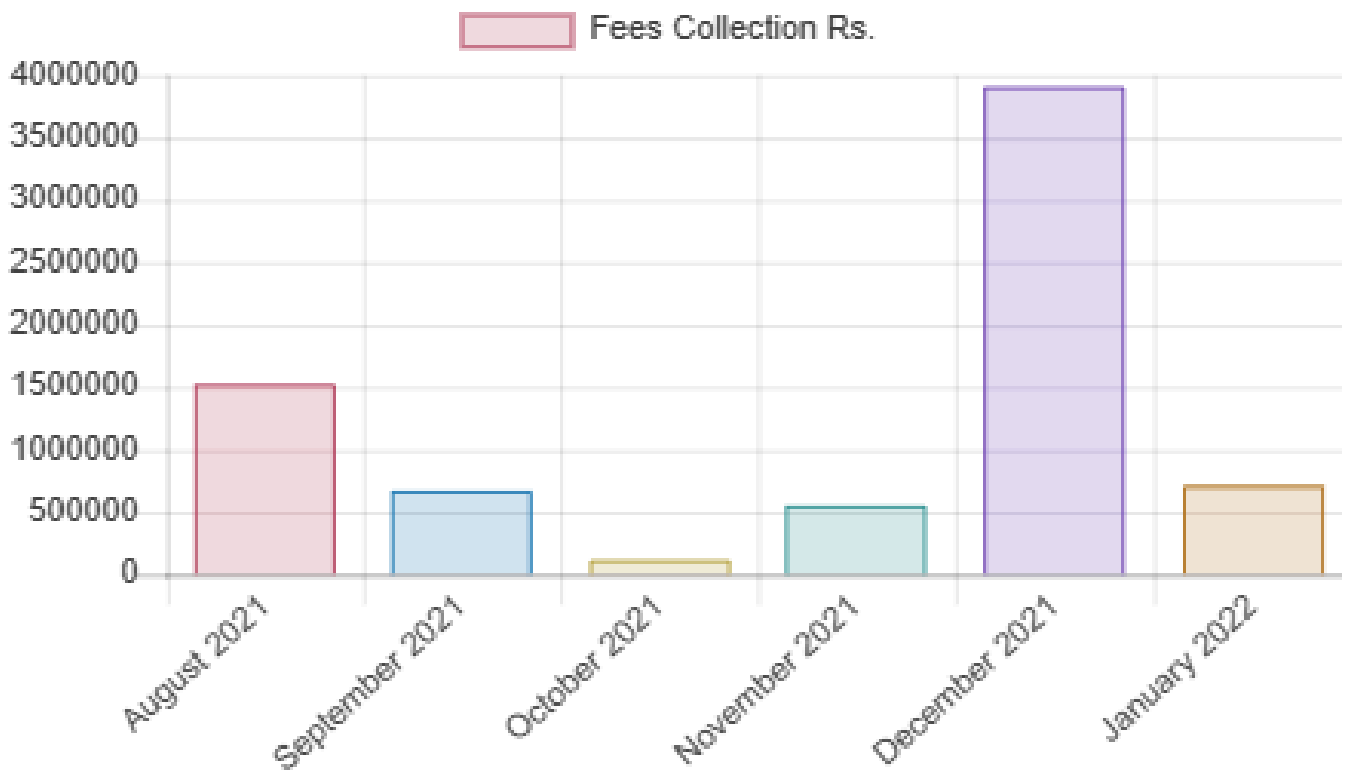
Sub-Committees and their Activities





- Time table should be strictly followed by each and everybody to discharge his/her duties like teaching, research or innovation programme(s) of the department and the Institution.
- Regular departmental meeting (at least 4 times in every academic year) must be carried out. In the departmental meetings following agenda must be discussed:
 1. Students' attendances of the department.
 2. Students' grievances (if any) at departmental level
 3. Purchase of the Books (Text Book and Reference Book) and Journals
 4. Timely coverage of syllabus and allotment of provisional class on students' demand
 5. Students' performances (e., Trend analysis of the successive results of the last 5 years).
 6. Dropdown case (if any) and the probable reason(s) behind the same
 7. Allotment of remedial and tutorial classes
 8. Analysis of students' feedback and the steps taken keeping in tune with the demands arising from the feedback.
 9. Departmental achievements (if any)
 10. Departmental needs for the betterment of academic infrastructure
 11. Proper management of the departmental library
 12. Academic issues regarding department
 13. Departmental publication (if any)
- Students should be informed in advance regarding the non-holding of class(es) (if any) due to the leave of absence of the teacher. Head of the Department will have to take initiatives for informing the students regarding the same through the notice displayed in the departmental Notice Board.

- Class(es) may be allotted a provisional basis among the available teacher(s) ensuring that no class should be non-holding.
- Assisting in planning & implementation of academic programmes, like, arranging remedial classes, tutorials; organizing training programs, seminars / workshops / lecture etc, both at the Departmental level and Institutional level for enhancing academic competence of the students as well as of faculty members and non-teaching staff.
- Departmental library should be maintained properly.
- Maintain correspondence relating to the administration / appraisal of the Department/ College to the appropriate authority.
- Administration and supervision of curricular, co-curricular / extra-curricular activities, and welfare of the Department / College, and proper maintenance of records.
- Compliance of the Act, University Statutes, Government Ordinances, Regulations, Rules and other Orders issued thereunder from time to time.
- Any other work relating to the Department / College as may be assigned to him/her by the Competent Authority / Statutory Bodies / various committees from time to time
- Looking after the general welfare of the of the students and teachers
- Observance and implementation of directives issued by Government, Directorate of Education / Higher Education / Affiliating University and other concerned authorities
- Timely submission of information / returns to different authorities viz. Government / University / University Grants Commission / Management etc. especially regarding Accounts matters

Code of Conduct for the Teachers

As our institution is, exclusively, an academic institution specially constituted for Teaching & Learning of Higher Education, so Teachers have to take crucial roles for the overall academic development of the Mahavidyalaya. For intra-departmental and inter-departmental quality enhancement; and for academic assurance, excellence and its upliftment; both Teachers & Students are in the central points and they have to act as an integral part of proper functioning; and the teachers have to maintain liaison with the college management. Teachers should take part and play a key role in different administrative duties / responsibilities time to time as and when allotted / assigned to as per requirements of the different subcommittees. Although there are specific guidelines in the statute, regulations and Act of the affiliating University, State Government and UGC circulated from time to time; yet, the following code of conducts will also to be followed in addition to these rules & resolutions for the betterment of academic environment of the Institution.

- Time table should be strictly followed by each and everybody to discharge his/her duties like teaching, research or innovation programme(s) of the department and the Institution.
- Students should be informed in advance regarding the non-holding class(es) (if any) due to leave of absence of the teacher. Head of the Department will have to take initiatives for informing the students regarding the same through the notice displayed in departmental Notice Board.
- To maintain and look after the regularities of the allotted class in time.
- Priorities should be given for the completion of the syllabus, and on requirement pedagogical analysis and measure should be taken into consideration.
- Lesson Plan / Unit Plan should be maintained properly.
- Priorities should be given to use of various ICT tools and techniques of education during the Classroom teaching. Different types of methodology of teaching may be adopted as per requirement depending on the quality of students.
- Participation in the teaching, research, and training programmes of the Department / College
- Assisting in planning & implementation of academic programmes, like, arranging remedial classes, tutorials; organizing training programs, seminars / workshops / lecture etc., both at the Departmental level and Institutional level for enhancing academic competence of the students as well as faculty members and non-teaching staffs through faculty development programmes.
- To help in the admission process of students and to maintain the discipline of the Department / College.
- Should take part and play an active role in management of Departmental Library / College Library, Laboratory, Multigym, Auditorium, Seminar hall and Hostels as and when duty(ies) is/are allotted to him/her by the appropriate body / head of the departments.
- To maintain and provide updates relating to appraisal of the Department/ College / Teacher to the relevant authority the administration.
- Administration and supervision of curricular, co-curricular / extra-curricular activities, and programme relating to social welfare of the Department/College, and maintenance of its records.
- Compliance to the Act, University Statutes, Government Ordinances, Regulations, Rules and other Orders issued there under from time to time.
- Supervision of Examinations, setting of question papers, moderation and assessment of answer papers and such other work pertaining to the Examinations of Department / College and University as assigned.
- Any other work relating to the Department / College as may be assigned to him/her by the Competent / Statutory Authority from time to time

- To safe-guard the interests of teachers / non-teaching staff members and the Management

Professional Ethics of the Teacher:

A. Obligations towards Students

1. Treat all students with love and affection.
2. Provide an innovative and quality education.
3. Interact with the students in a friendly manner.
4. Collaborate & cooperative with fellow colleagues.
5. Help, guide, encourage and assist students in their learning.
6. Be good counselors and facilitators.
7. Respect the value of being just and impartial to all students irrespective of their caste, creed, religion, sex, economic status, disability, language and place of birth.
8. Facilitate students' physical, social, intellectual, emotional, and moral development.
9. Respect basic human dignity of the students in all aspects.
10. Make planned and systematic efforts to facilitate the student to actualize his/her potential and talent.
11. Transact the curriculum in conformity with the values enshrined in the Constitution of India.
12. Adapt his/her teaching capability to the individual needs of students.
13. Maintain the confidentiality of the information concerning students and dispenses such information only to those who are legitimately entitled to it.
14. Refrain from subjecting any student to fear, trauma, anxiety, physical punishment, sexual abuse, and mental and emotional harassment.
15. Keep a dignified demeanor commensurate with the expectations from a teacher as a role model.

B. Obligations towards Parents, Community and Society

1. Establish a relationship of trust with parents/guardians in the interest of all round development of students.
2. Be responsible and interact positively with parents and other stakeholders in educating the students.
3. Desist from doing anything which is derogatory to the respect of the child or his/her parents/guardians.
4. Strive to develop respect for the composite culture of India among students.
5. Keep the country uppermost in mind, refrains from taking part in such activities as may spread feelings of hatred or enmity among different communities, religious or linguistic groups.

C. Obligations towards the Profession and Colleagues

1. Strive for his/her continuous professional development.
2. Create a culture that encourages purposeful collaboration and dialogue among colleagues and stakeholders.
3. Take pride in the teaching profession and treat other members of the profession with respect and dignity.
4. Refrain from engaging himself/herself in private tuition or private teaching activity.
5. Refrain from accepting any gift, or favour that might impair or appear to influence professional decisions or actions.
6. Refrain from making unsubstantiated allegations against colleagues or higher authorities.
7. Avoid making derogatory statements about colleagues, especially in the front of pupils, other teachers, officials or parents.
8. Respect the professional standing and opinions of his/her colleagues.
9. Maintain confidentiality of information concerning colleagues and dispenses such information only when authorized to do so.

Code of Conduct for the Non-Teaching Staff

The non-teaching staff play a significant role in realizing the vision and goals of Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya and contribute by way of hard working and dedication. The Mahavidyalaya hopes that the non-teaching staff shall maintain high standards of professional conduct, act with integrity and in a manner that will contribute to creating a positive image of the Mahavidyalaya.

Every staff member shall, therefore, have to –

- Remain on duty during college hours.
- Maintain honesty, integrity, fairness in the administration
- Adhere strictly to the laws and regulations of the college.
- Deal properly and positively with staff, students and the parents.
- Must not be absent from duty without official approval or approved sick leave.
- Every staff have a definite role to do function in a meaningful way.
- Uphold the ideals of Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya and work for the development and realization of the vision and goals of the Institution,
- There should not be any gap/delay in the emergency service like electricity, water supply due to leave of absence. In such cases Head Clerk should take necessary action and arrangement / allotment of duty to fill the stop gap on an urgent basis.
- Abide by the rules and regulations of the college, and be diligent and punctual in carrying out all duties preferably in time,

- To finish all duties assigned in a time-bound manner to overcome the situation smoothly for the University, Department of Higher Education and UGC,
- Foster a spirit of respect, affection and gratitude towards the Mahavidyalaya and authority with full of etiquette and manners amongst the pupils,
- Be polite, honest and candid in interaction with others. Any shorts of problem received from any person should be immediately communicated to the immediate higher authority at their level and by no way involve personally in the official matter.
- Always carrying and helping attitude towards students, guardians, teachers or anyone who is/are asking for help.
- Official secrets should be maintained. Confidential documents should be maintained in the respective custodian level, and providing any passing confidential document to anyone without the permission of the competent authority should be treated a punishable offence.
- Behave in a respectful and courteous manner while dealing with all professional colleagues or other members of the Institution.
- Not to indulge in direct contact with a prospective student, shall make no promises or assertions with respect to consideration for admission or award of financial aid that are not consistent with existing policy or within the authority of the institutional framework.

Code of Conduct (Standards of behaviour for Security Guards) for the Security personnel

Personal Appearance: A Security Guard should

1. Always wear a presentable uniform, following the employer's guidelines, by which he can be easily identifiable as a SECURITY GUARD during on duty.
2. Wear and display photo-identity cards issued whilst on duty.

Professional attitude and skills: A Security Guard should

3. Greet visitors to the Mahavidyalaya in a friendly and courteous manner.
4. Be friendly and non-discriminate on the grounds of gender, sexual orientation, marital status, race, nationality, ethnicity, religion or beliefs, disability, or any other difference in individuals.
5. Carry out the duties in a professional and courteous manner with due regard and consideration to others.
6. Behave with personal integrity and understanding.
7. Use moderate language, which is not defamatory or abusive, when dealing with members of the public and colleagues.
8. Be fit for work and remain alert at all times.
9. Develop knowledge of local services and amenities appropriately.

General Conduct in Carrying Out the Duty: A Security Guard should

10. Never solicit or accept any bribe or other consideration from any person.
11. Not drink alcohol or be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
12. Not display preferential treatment towards individuals.
13. Never carry any item which is or could be considered threatening
14. Report all incidents to the management.
15. Cooperate fully with members of the Police, Local Authority, SIA, and other statutory agencies with an interest in the Site/Company or the way they are run.

Organization values and standards – A Security Guard should

16. Make himself familiar with the employing Institution /Company standards.
17. Be perceptive of the employing Site/Company culture and values.
18. Contribute to the goals and objectives of the employing Organization / Company.

Local ‘House’ rules: A Security Guard should

19. Make yourself familiar with the Site he is working at i.e., Building Layout, Emergency Exits, Gates, CCTV, Muster Points, Fire Alarm Positions and Fire Fighting Equipment.
20. Report any hazards or incidents that have occurred throughout the course of the night and the outcome of them in the incident book at end of every night.
21. Look after and support the welfare and needs of your colleagues whilst on duty.
22. Not use mobile phones during the duty hours except the emergency services.

Code of Conduct for Students

- Continuous and consecutive absence for 15 days should be liable for cancellation of candidature of students as per provision.
- Students must carry their multipurpose card e. Library cum Identity Cards each and every day when on campus and produce it on demand by the security guards or any authority of the Institute.
- Mobile phones must be kept in silent mode inside the lecture hall, seminar hall, library, computer lab, examination hall, syndicate and common room, etc. If this stricture is not followed by the students, then the college authority may confiscate the phone.
- Students must enter into the class before the scheduled time. No students will be allowed to enter the class after 5 minutes of scheduled time of initiation of class.
- Attendance in every class is mandatory.

- During class hours a student cannot go out of the classroom without the permission of the concerned teacher.
- Ragging of any sort is strictly prohibited and will be dealt with serious punitive measures. Institution follows a policy of zero tolerance towards ragging. Any student found guilty of inciting ragging or involved in it in any form will face the punitive measures – starting from cancellation of a session to rustication from the Institute.
- Absence from tests / examination / tutorials and non-submission of assignments in time will make a student ineligible for internal assessment. No excuse will be entertained thereafter.
- Students must participate in Sports, Socio-Cultural events conducted by the Students' Union / College Authority time to time.
- Students' Union office will remain open in the office time only.
- Office of the GS / Student's representative will remain under lock & key beyond the office hour. Only GS / Student's representative will be the custodian of this room for the Academic Session he/she is elected/selected/nominated.
- Member room also remain open in the office hours only and thereafter it will be under lock & key.
- During the period of vacation / recess when the teaching and learning period totally stopped, and The Students' Union are not in function, at that time the keys of the Union office and member office must be in the custody of the College office until its functional state.
- Students are required to have at least 75% attendance on delivered class lectures of every subject to appear in the University Examination as per statutory provision of the University.
- Students have to park their vehicles within the stipulated parking space allotted by the College Authority.
- Both boys and girls' students have to maintain the harmonious relation for enhancing the quality culture of a standard co-educational Institute.
- During leisure hours, students are advised to use the library, and computer lab.
- Students should stay away from any anti-social activities.
- Grievances (if any) should be immediately informed to the Grievance Redressal Cell for an immediate action.

- Smoking within the college campus is strictly prohibited and it should be treated as a punishable offence.
- The college campus is plastic free. Carrying of any kind of plastic bag / carry bag (below 70µ thickness) inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- Waste materials should be placed in the proper dustbin according to category e., Biodegradable, Non-Biodegradable but recyclable, and Non-recyclable waste in Green, Yellow and Red dustbin respectively.
- All types of payment for fees should be done preferably through online mode, and offline mode of payment should be avoided as much as practicable.
- None of the payment should be made without any receipt. Transaction without any receipt within the campus should be treated as a punishable offence.
- Details should be entered in the register while availing laboratory or library facilities.
- Visitors are not allowed to meet the students in the classrooms.
- Students should take care of their belongings. The institution will not be responsible for any loss.

Library Code of Conduct

- While entering the Library, visitors / students / teachers are required to sign on to the respective registrar and leave their bags, hats etc., at the counter in the entrance.
- Maintain discipline and silence in the Library.
- Cell phones, Audio visuals & Eatables are restricted in the Library.
- While leaving the library, all the materials such as books, magazines, newspapers, chairs etc. should be kept in order and in a proper place.
- Do not put any pencil mark, book mark either on a book or on a journal/periodical/magazine.
- For the misbehavior and mischievous activities in the library, students will have to face serious consequences up to the level of expulsion from the Library for the whole term.
- Books overdue more than stipulated period of 15 days would be charged @ Rs. 2/- per day as a fine.
- While receiving or returning a book, do come personally along with the library card. Users are not allowed to take away any book on behalf of their friend or anybody.
- While receiving/taking books, check the condition of the book and any damage therein should be reported to the library staff. Afterwards no complaints will be entertained and the last borrower will be held responsible for the act.
- The books lost by reader / borrower or due against his / her name more than one semester will be recovered from them either a replacement copy of the same or a printed cost of the book. A clearance certificate from the librarian is a must for getting the mark sheet from the college office.

- While issuing the books, the students should submit a requisition slip in the morning session and collect the books in the afternoon session. Without requisition slip no book will be issued.

Having enumerated all the points in the “Code of Conduct” it is meaningless until and unless we behave professionally with the spirit of ethics. Ethical behaviour should be accompanied by respect and courtesy to others in the profession. In a nutshell the following points should be kept in mind by all.

- *Showing respect for all;*
- *Refraining from criticism to others;*
- *Always welcome constructive criticism for the betterment of the institution;*
- *Making certain when participating in joint activities that collaborators receive due credit for their contributions;*
- *Using the office, title and professional associations only for the conduct of official business.*

Facilities within the campus

Central Library:

College Library of Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya started its journey in a small room of the Institute old Building (Vidyasagar Hall) in the year 1970, and moved to its present premises in 2012. Since then, it has grown in size and content to take the present shape. . For few years, the library has become the lifeline of the academic activities of the Institute. It has been catering to the needs of our students of undergraduates, postgraduates, faculty and staff members.

The library has a collection of more than 30,000 volumes which includes text Books, reference books & printed journals, etc. It has also special collection of books on Swami Vivekananda and Swami Swarupananda. With the development of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), the behavioural characteristics of the library users have been changing rapidly and the library is trying its best to adapt with the technological advancement.

The College Library has developed computer based information storage and retrieval system in the multi-user environment using KOHA software; an Open Source Library Management Software package. The identity of all books and the library users are fully bar-coded and all Library house-keeping operations like, acquisition, cataloguing and circulation services have been automated with the help of KOHA software package.

The book database is accessible through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). Now it is a partially automated modern library is on its way to becoming an outstanding learning resource centre catering to the ever growing and uncompromising information and intellectual requirements of the students, faculty members of the Institute. To

ensure proper surveillance, electronic surveillance system has been adopted in some important service areas within the library.

The Library has recently installed 802.11n based Wi-Fi service for all Student, Staff, Faculty and Non-teaching staff Members with free of cost. The library also has a well-equipped Xerox centre and the users can avail this facility on payment of a nominal charge.

Computer Lab

There is a well-equipped and well decorated computer laboratory with internet facilities. Department of Mathematics, Commerce, Economics, Physics, Chemistry use it as a departmental laboratory by sharing as well as all students can use it as required.

WiFi campus

There are 10 dedicated unlimited Internet connection of BSNL are available under the special programme of UGC in the college. there are several points of the vast college premises were covered by the LAN and WiFi router points that covers Offices, Controller section, Central Library, all the PG Departments, and old buildings etc. The college provides IP enabled WiFi accessibility within the premises. Recently we provided internet to the ICT enabled class Rooms and Virtual Class Room of the college. Fibre Optics based data transfer technology (maximum speed of data transfer up to 450Mbps) along with 10 dedicated Broadband service of BSNL (100 Mbps data transfer rate) installed in the campus. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled with a high speed internet connection allow the students to access the internet in a certain Hot Spots in certain selected areas. The coverage of Wi-Fi is not only facilitated to class rooms but also extends to all the areas including Departmental Office Room, library, Laboratory, Auditorium. Some of the usable point is the nearby areas of the administrative building. for extreme cases MAC activated filters or IP based connection were activated to minimize the data mismanagement.

e-Books and Magazine

Only registered students can access this e-BOOKS Library. Interested students may ask for User ID (usually it would be their phone Number that was used during the Admission in this institution) and password to access the free E-BOOK library through a secured login procedure i.e. OTP based authentication procedure is allow to access the facilities. BOOKS freely available in the Global repository doesn't require any authentication procedure. It is directly accessible. There are Millions of e-BOOKS also available in the Global repository covered every angle of the subjects. Under the guidance of the Principal and the initiative of the students' union, printed magazines and wall magazines are published every year. Departmental wall magazine is also

published. Some departments publish the student's journals and Departmental Journals.

Vidyasagar Auditorium Hall of the Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya is recently build and renovated with its State of Art facilities along with all essential requirements. This is a moderate hall built to enable an audience of 200 seating capacity to hear and watch performances. This hall is oriented with the acoustic treatment with high quality (HD) sounds and background multimedia projection facility. In addition, we also have a seprate seminal hall.

Athletics

There is sufficient arrangement for outdoor games such Foot Ball, Cricket, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Hand Ball, Badminton etc. in the college. The students of the college win some prize from University level competition.

Common Room

There are two separate common rooms, one for male students and other for female students. Students are provided newspapers, magazines, different indoor game facilities like carom, table tennis etc.

Vidyasagar Path Parishad

With a view to fostering a sense of culture in the locality, Vidyasagar Path Parishad being established in the year 1970, 150 Birth Anniversary of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, organises several competitions every year among its members from neighbouring educational and cultural institutions including mother institution. The Parishad organises meeting, seminar, yoga camp, career counselling programme etc. which are addressed by the eminent guest.

Departmental Library

Departmental library is available in each department. Some departments also have open book corners. Students of the concerned department can use these libraries easily.

Hostels

There are two hostels - one for male students and one for female students under control of the college hostel committee. Two hostel superintendents appointed by the college administration to supervise the hostels and maintain the books of accounts.

b. Nivedita Girls Hostel

- **Admission to hostel:** The students seeking admission to hostel for a particular session are required to apply in the prescribed form to the superintendent. The seats allotted to the students are notified and the students are required to pay the fees and charges at the time of admission.
- **Charges:** Establishment charge including electric, seat rent, cook etc. should be deposited by the student at the time of admission. Messing charge should be deposited by the student in every month as required.
- **Discipline:**
 1. Attendance compulsory for both the morning and evening prayer.
 2. Strict discipline is to be maintained during the study hours.
 3. Students must observe the study hours prescribed by the authority.
 4. Use of common room is strictly prohibited during the study hours.
 5. Lunch and dinner time is strictly maintained by the students as per the prescribed schedule of the authorities.
 6. The boarders of the room concerned are to purchase the bulb, etc. at their own expenses. The authority will make arrangement to their effect only the very beginning of the new session for once.
 7. No guest will allow to stay overnight in the hostel.
 8. No boarders are allowed to stay during the vacations like Summer, Puja, X-mas etc.

WiFi Campus

Internet connections are available in the departments including the college office. The college will be a Wi Fi campus very shortly.

Virtual Classroom (VCR)

Virtual classroom (VCR), is a class that has the students and teachers linked together on a network using the Internet or intranet etc, while physically being miles apart, interacting and studying in real time. This classroom is alienable with high speed internet and Statics IP Camera that can be used for the video conferencing with other such systems specially with the remote one. In this class room live video streaming may be possible that can be watched and interacted on demand.

How does a virtual classroom work?

Using Web-based interactive programs both the trainers and the learners interact in a “real” time environment. At the appointed time both the students and trainers come online to attend the class. Just like a regular, conventional class. Once a session starts, everyone is a part of the live session that is seen by all the students, however away they are from each other. Virtual classroom works using audio and video conferencing tools that are easily configurable and can also be used to show pre-recorded video tapes and CDs as well. Virtual classrooms have redefined e-Learning in today’s world.

Students can interact with the trainers and they can solve their queries instantly online. Not only this, students can also interact with each other with the help of a chat tool feature. This is just like ordinary chatting tools used by Web users all around the world. More and more advanced e-Learning solutions are being designed everyday, at the heart of which are the virtual class rooms, which are being touted as a better option to regular class rooms.

Virtual class room have an edge over conventional class rooms as they can be recorded and played back verbatim by the learners, something not possible in a regular class. Just like the class room has a black board, virtual class room also has a software tool called whiteboard – which can be used to explain certain queries and draw diagrams, etc.

Other standard tools like presentations, image files, html files etc can also be uploaded on the whiteboard – thus if you already have some study material then it can be easily plugged into a virtual classroom. Online test and evaluation features are also available that constantly gauge the extent of understanding of the trainee and provide feedback on assignments.

Benefits of virtual classroom

- It saves time – Conventional learning processes like classrooms require space and cost more, in terms of infrastructure required, getting all the learners and trainers together, etc. virtual class room and other e-Learning tools, on the other hand, save space and cost much less; it can accommodate a large number of students within the same training solutions at no extra costs.
- Excellent for executives on the move – e-Learning is fast becoming the ideal choice for the executive on the move.
- Interaction between teachers and students, just like a regular classroom with an added advantage of recording and sharing data, information and entire e-Learning sessions.
- Storage of the whole process of training through an Automatic Repository Creation on the computer for future reference.
- Standardization of content.
- Due to standardized content, a change of trainer does not hamper the training session.

Opportunities in virtual classroom

Great opportunities exist in the arena of Virtual classrooms in the fields of:

- Great opportunities also exist in areas of new induction training where a standardized induction program will help a new entrant.
- When the organization has employees spanning continents it will be useful to have virtual classrooms for them all.

In fact the whole world is now becoming a global class room with colleges, institutes, even Universities holding virtual classes for its students and the corporate world using it to train its employees across the globe!

ICT Enabled Classroom

With modern facilities like ICT in combination with audio-visual facilities the faculty has started exploring the use of technology in teaching, which has resulted in implementing the blended learning process for students in the classrooms. Computer assisted learning and digital materials are made available to the students to supplement classroom teaching. We designed our website in such a manner that handouts, class notes, used ppts along with some audio-visual lectures made available in the repository of the archive the interested students can use apart from the classroom teaching in extreme condition. Seven classrooms recently modified into ICT based on the Interactive Board. Most of these are PG (Six) and one in the Botany class Room. Another fifteen LCD Projectors were installed in the different UG classrooms in the campus. Beside this there is a virtual classroom which is also well equipped with ICT and Interactive Projector. We are trying to connect all the ICT based classrooms into a single live and dynamic domain for easy access of all information.

CCTV Surveillance

Closed-circuit television (CCTV), also known as video surveillance (VS), is the use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors. In recent years CCTV is widely used in different institutions due to its success in preventing bullying, vandalism, monitoring visitors and maintaining a record of evidence in the event of a crime. There are some restrictions on installation, with cameras not being installed in an area where there is a “reasonable expectation of privacy”. In our institution it was installed over the years. However, recently we are increasing its view points of surveillance through most recent technology of communication media *i.e. Fiber Optics*. More than hundreds of CCTV cameras were installed throughout the lawn and main transit areas of the premises. All the camera monitors and transfer high rate of data to the nVRs & DVRs all the time (24×7) without any intervention.

A. AS SOON AS FEEL UNWELL

Stay calm. Remember that most people recover from [#COVID19](#) and do not require hospitalization.

1. Self-isolate. Do not wait to get tested or receive results.
2. Check your oxygen levels every 6 hours or more frequently if your breaths are too fast. Check it once and then again after a six-minute walk.
 1. Seek emergency care if oxygen level on the oximeter shows less than 94%.
 2. Monitor your temperature every 6 hours. Do it more frequently if you have a fever.
 1. Seek emergency care if fever of more than 101F (38C) persists for 3 days.
 2. Seek emergency medical care in any of these cases:

1. Shortness of breath worsens
2. Lips or face turn blueish
3. Feeling of disorientation increases
4. Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
5. Slurred speech / seizures
6. Unable to wake up or stay awake

B. HOW TO MANAGE Milder COVID-19 AT HOME

1. Only have medicines a doctor prescribes.
 1. Do not self-medicate. Home concoctions like garlic, camphor and carom seed (ajwain) bundles cannot improve oxygen levels.
2. Take paracetamol (500mg) every 4 to 6 hours if you have a high temperature, aches or pains.
 1. Do not have more than 4 doses maximum within a 24-hour period.
2. Stay hydrated (drink water) and eat nutritious meals even if you are unable to taste. There is no food known to treat or cure COVID-19 but eating healthy will help your body recover.
3. Do tepid sponging using tap water. Do not use cold water.

C. STAY CALM AND SELF-ISOLATE

How to manage #COVID19 at home.

1. Isolate yourself in a separate room with bathroom if possible for 10 days and rest.
1. Rest, relax, rest, relax.
 2. Keep your mind busy by reading books, watching TV shows and having video calls with your family and friends.

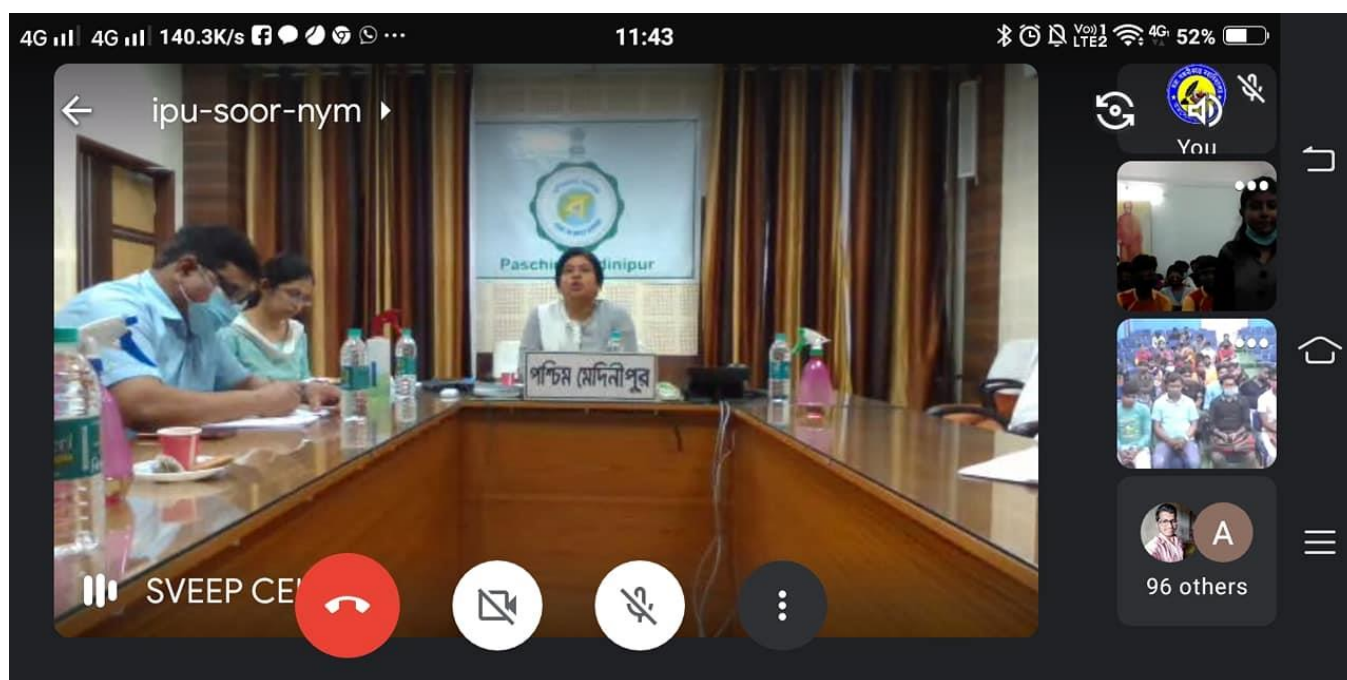
Students Sensitization Programme:

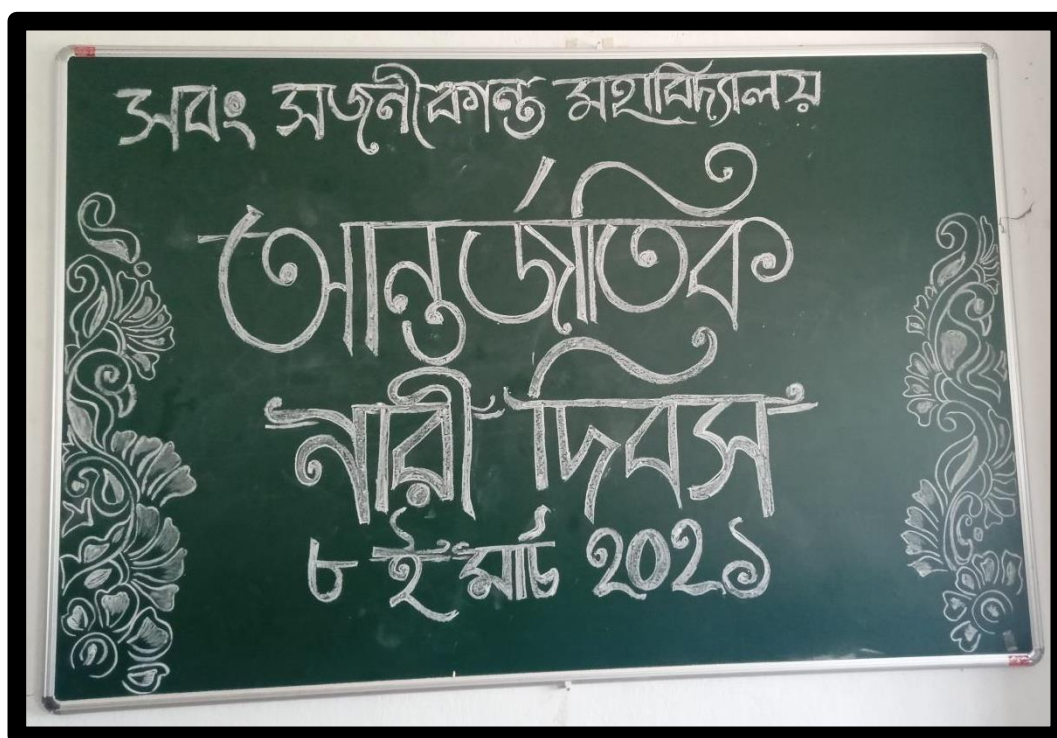
Extension activities/ career counselling
