

The Mahavidyalaya is established with a mission to disseminate higher education among the deserving pupils coming from the marginalized families of the remote areas of Sabang. Sabang is a poor agricultural belt, predominantly comprising of small cultivators, agricultural labourers, landless, and under-privileged artisans of backward communities. The founder of the college had envisaged a mission of creating at least one graduate in every household. Corroborating with the mission of the Mahavidyalaya “TAMOSA MA JYOTIRGAMAYA” which means “lead me towards light from darkness”. This symbolizes the ‘motto of the Mahavidyalaya’.

##### ***Vision***

The Mahavidyalaya was established by the intuitive educationist and local philanthropists. They had a common vision of unearthing the potentially of the young learners of the area. The institution till holds that vision close to its chest and takes stride to achieve excellence in every subject walks extra miles for quest of new knowledge.

#### 6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System:

Yes, the college has Management Information System in areas like online admission, internal assessment, office management, management of accounts and student grievance redressal.

#### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

##### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Our College is affiliated to the Vidyasagar University, Midnapore and bound to follow the University Syllabi designed by the University Board of Studies. So there is no scope of development of curriculum on its own.

##### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

1. Teachers participates Faculty Development Programme.

3. Experimental projects are carried out under the guidance of departmental teachers which are then evaluated by both the department and the Affiliating University appointed external examiners.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

1. The college creates an academic environment that ignites and fosters research culture of the college. In order to promote research activities, college have constituted a Research Advisory committee (RAC).
2. Various departments of the college have organized seminars//invited lectures to accelerate the research ambience of the college.
3. Teachers are involved in Minor Research Project and Major Research Project receiving grants from various funding agencies.

### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

1. Physical infrastructure of the library has been improved.
2. Off library facilities available.

8. Some office staffs have also been given laptops.
9. Office is well equipped with desktops, scanners and printers along with browsing centres.
10. College is secured by the boundary wall.
11. One well-equipped gymnasium hall helps sports loving students.
12. One well-equipped Auditorium /Seminar /conference hall stimulates the academicians.
13. Most of the Science Departments rooms are with SMART Boards facilities and well-equipped laboratories.
14. Staff room is equipped with TV LCD screen, water purifier, and attached bathroom facilities.
15. Students' union room are fully equipped with TV LCD screen.
16. Canteen with all time food and beverage facility.

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

1. Self Appraisal is done at regular intervals to evaluate the performance of the teaching staff.
2. Feedback from students is taken to assess the performance of the faculty members.
3. Teachers are encouraged to various Capacity building training programmes & Faculty development programmes to enhance efficiency.
4. Student Career & Counseling Cell extends its counseling service for future up-liftment of the student's career.
5. Concession/Scholarships were given to the deserving students on college fee and hostel fees concession
6. Faculties are assigned responsibilities to organize curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

1. Full time teaching faculties are appointed by the recommendation of West Bengal College Service Commission as per guidelines of UGC.
2. Guest teaching faculties are recruited following two step process: advertisement in daily newspaper & college website and interview by University experts, and subject experts as per UGC norms.
3. Appointment of the permanent non- teaching staff is done following the norms of the Directorate of Public Instruction, Govt. of West Bengal.
