# Revised New Syllabus for M.A. in Sanskrit, 2022

#### Proposed Syllabus for P. G. Course

The Department of Sanskrit, Vidyasagar University is offering M. A. course in Sanskrit under the Semester CBCS system with the following syllabus.

The syllabus assumes in the students an interest in higher learning and aims at equipping them for an academic career.

The Post graduate programme in this system will be divided into 18 (eighteen) Core Courses and 2(two) Extra Departmental Courses (CBCS) and will consist of Four Semesters to be covered in two years: the First and Second Semester in the first year, and the Third and Fourth semester in the Second year. Each Semester consist five courses with equal Marks: For each course Total Marks: 50(Theoretical Exam-40, Internal Assessment-10). We offer two extra departmental Courses as a part of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) one each in Second semester (SAN-204) and in the Third semester (SAN-304).

At present four optional groups (Group-A: LITERATURE, Group-B: PĀŅINĪYA VYĀKARAŅA, GROUP- C: INDIAN PHILOSOPY and GROUP- D: NYĀYA-VAIŚEṢIKA PHILOSOPHY) will be offered in the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4th Semester. There will be restriction in opting these courses.

#### PROGRAMME OUTCOME

After having completed Masters Degree in Sanskrit, the Students will become experts in different fields of Vedic as well as classical Sanskrit language and literature. The programme mast have important role to enhance ethical, psychological, historical, philosophical, cultural learning at individual, social and national level which is more essential now a days. Those who are experts in Vedic literature both of Karmakāṇḍa and Jñānakaṇḍa will be able to utilize their skills in the field of social engagement like Yajña, Pujā, Śrāddha, Marriage etc. Those who are specialized in Sanskrit Grammar and Linguistics will be able to work as interpreters, translators and even they can work at IITs for National Language Processing (NLP), Programming (being Computer talking language) etc. apart from their teachership. Those who are experts in Indian Philosophy will be privileged to work at Judicial Court as a lawyer. This will not be enough to say that the students digested this programme can utilize their skills in the field of social work, environmental at protection, human & animal rights and many issues related to present-day globalizing world.

Without the knowledge of Indian logic exhibited by the Nyāya-Vaiśeṣika system of Indian Philosophy, one cannot penetrate into the Sanskrit Śāstras. Therefore this special paper will be the most useful for the beginners of Nyāya-Vaiśeṣika. This special paper of Nyāya-Vaiśeṣika can be helpful for the Students to acquire the basic knowledge of Nyāya-Vaiśeṣika Philosophy and to apply the method of argument and technique of using appropriate language in order to understand and demonstrate the theories of different Śāstras.
